

Reasonable Adjustments for Examinations - 2022

The Office of Tasmanian Assessment, Standards & Certification (TASC) provides for reasonable adjustments to be made for students who are unable to be assessed in the same way as other students.

Reasons students may be eligible for reasonable adjustments include:

- Medical condition
- Physical disability
- Psychological disorder
- Specific learning disorder
- Hearing Impairment
- Vision Impairment

Adjustments may include:

- extra time
- use of medication
- access to a reader or scribe
- permission to move around or leave the exam room under supervision
- alternative format papers for vision and aural impairment
- provision of advice to markers about spelling, grammar or poor handwriting
- borderline consideration

TASC does not provide special disability provisions for students on the basis of lack of familiarity with the English language. Nor do they provide reasonable adjustments or consideration to students for normal exam stress, unless a request was supported by medical evidence about a chronic condition that is undergoing ongoing treatment.
